GDP by State

- During 2014, South Dakota's economy continued to grow as the current dollar Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by state totaled \$45.9 billion, growing 2.7% over 2013. This growth ranked 37th among the states and compares to the US growth of 3.9% over the same time period.
- South Dakota's real (inflation adjusted) GDP by state in 2014 increased at a rate of 0.6%, less than the US growth rate of 2.2% for 2014.
 - The below average growth rate for South Dakota in 2014 is partially due to a 10% decline in the agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting industry from the prior year. Every state in the plains region (ND, MN, SD, IA, NE, KS, and MO) realized declines in this particular industry in 2014.

Employment growth in South Dakota

- In 2014, South Dakota nonfarm employment levels were 5,700 jobs higher than 2013, or an increase of 1.4%.
- In April 2015, total SD nonfarm employment was up 6,900 jobs or 1.6%, compared to April 2014.
 - Sectors that are currently experiencing year-over-year growth (April '15 compared to April '14 levels) include: logging, mining, and construction (+7.3%); manufacturing (+5.0%); other services (+2.5%); education and health services (+2.3%); trade, transportation, and utilities (+1.8%); leisure/hospitality (+1.3%); and government (+0.9%).
 - The sectors currently experiencing year-over-year declines during April were financial activities (-1.3%) and professional and business services (-4.0%).

The unemployment rate continues to be one of the lowest in the nation

- The unemployment rate in South Dakota was the fourth lowest in the nation in April at 3.6%.
 - SD's unemployment rate in April was 0.1% higher than March and 0.2% higher than a year ago.
- The US unemployment rate was 5.4% in April 2015.

Income growth in South Dakota

- South Dakota's preliminary personal income in 2014 increased 1.7% compared to 2013. This compares to the US growth rate of 3.9% over the same time period.
 - In 2014, South Dakota's farm income decreased 20.7% compared to 2013, which was the primary reason for the soft growth rate in total personal income in 2014. South Dakota nonfarm income grew 3.9%, slightly less than the national average growth rate of 4.1% in 2014.
- South Dakota's per capita personal income in 2014 was \$46,345, which ranked 21st in the nation, and was 0.5% higher than the US per capita personal income of \$46,129 during 2014.

The housing market

- In the last twelve months (May 2014 April 2015) there were 590 less total family housing units authorized by building permits in South Dakota than there were the same period before.*
- The value of total family housing building permits is \$28.51 million lower in the last twelve months compared to the same period the year before. *

The agricultural economy

- As of May 1st, South Dakota's 1,000+ capacity feedlots reported 240,000 cattle on feed for the slaughter market, which was up 9% from a year ago.
- Milk production in South Dakota during April of 2015 totaled 190 million pounds, up 10% from the same month a year ago. The average number of milk cows was 103,000 head, up 6,000 head compared to April of 2014.
- As of May 1st, South Dakota's winter wheat crop is forecast at 48.4 million bushels, down 19% from last year's crop. Yield is forecast at 44 bushels, down 11 bushels per acre from last year.
- As of June 7th, topsoil moisture supplies across the state were rated 20% short to very short while subsoil moisture supplies were rated 30% short to very short.




Recent Trends in Natural Resources, Mining and Construction Employment




Recent Trends in Manufacturing Employment




Recent Trends in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities Employment




Recent Trends in Financial Activities Employment




Recent Trends in Professional and Business Services Employment












Recent Trends in Nonfarm Employment (excluding Government Employment)




Recent Trends in the Number of Units Authorized by Residential Building Permits for South Dakota




Recent Trends in the Number of Residential Units Authorized by Building Permits for Minnehaha County




Recent Trends in the Number of Residential Units Authorized by Building Permits for Pennington County




Recent Trends in the Value of Residential Building Permits Issued for South Dakota




Recent Trends in the Value of Residential Building Permits Issued for Minnehaha County






Recent Trends in the Number of New Non-Commercial Vehicles Titled




